Our March meeting was held at the **Sloan Museum** in Flint which is part of the Flint Cultural Center. Following our club meeting and lunch, we toured the museum. Along on the tour were our guests, members of the R.E.Olds chapter. This museum is filled with exhibits and hands-on activities or sit-on activities as



demonstrated by Pat Kress. There are three permanent exhibits: "20<sup>th</sup> Century Flint & the

American Dream;" "Hallway Café"; "Wisner's



Whizbang Emporium". They also house temporary exhibits and the ones we got to view on our visit included "Michigan in the Civil War" and "Space: Journey to our Future". Other features include artifacts, photographs and displays chronicling Flint's history.

Our tour also included a visit to the **Buick Automotive Gallery** where we got to see a special exhibit titled Truck & Bus. This exhibit featured the workhorses of the auto world—pick-up trucks. In the words of the pamphlet I picked up, "today's pick up is far more than a simple automobile with a cab and a storage bed. ## THE END OF AN ERA


